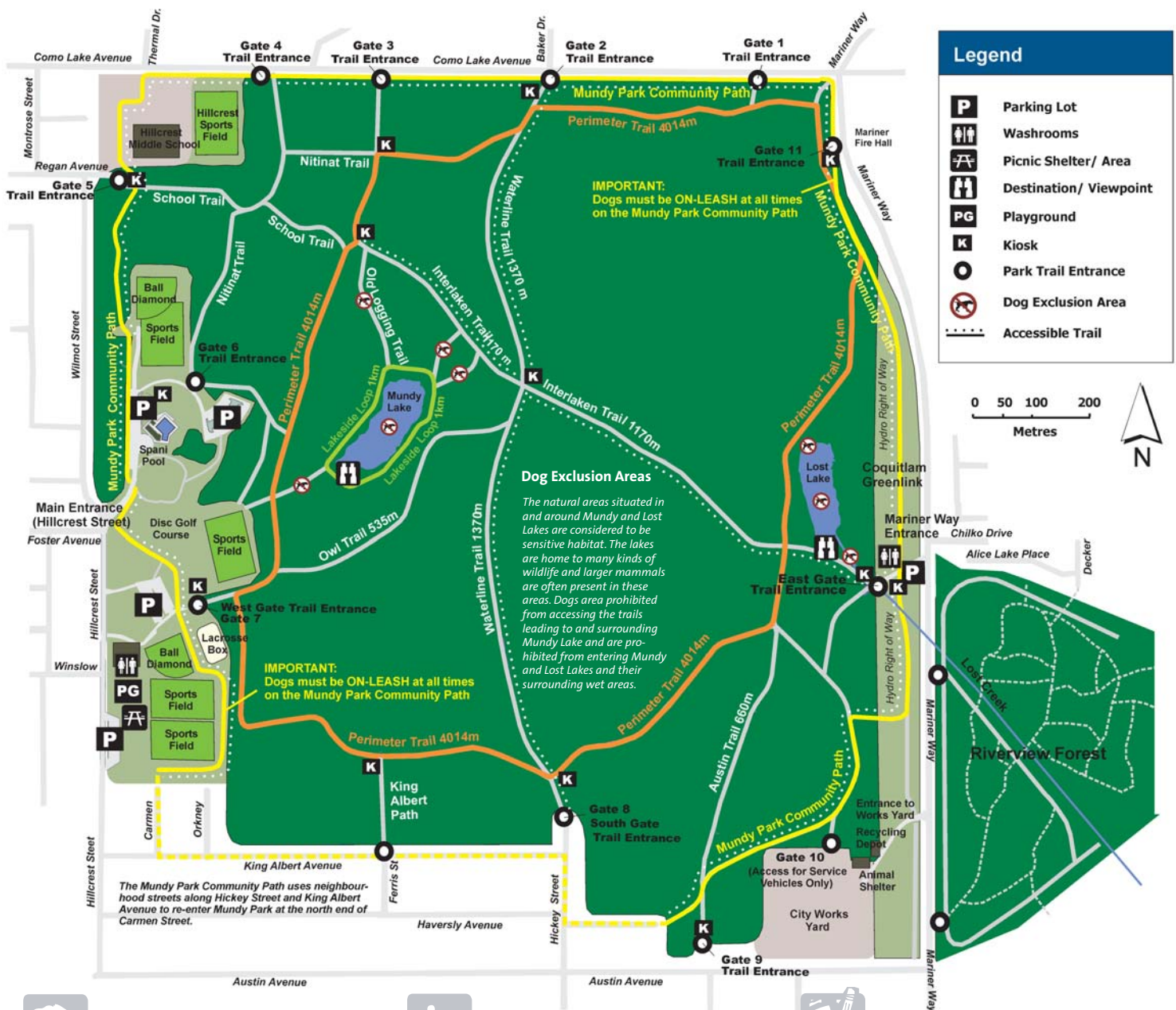


Mundy Park Trails



Wildlife

When venturing into Mundy Park always remember that you are a visitor to wildlife habitat. Mundy Park is known to be frequently visited by larger animals such as bears, coyotes and deer. Do not provoke or startle wildlife and never leave food or garbage on the trails. Make your presence known by talking loudly, clapping or occasionally singing. Accessible Trails

Accessible trail is the term given to trails with a surface that allows for easy access and mobility for wheelchairs.
